

TRANSFER ARTICUALTION AGREEMENT

between

LANE COMMUNITY COLLEGE, UNITED STATES OF AMERICA

and

OTAGO POLYTECHNIC, NEW ZEALAND

for

ASSOCIATES OF APPLIED SCIENCE IN GRAPHIC DESIGN

to

BACHELOR OF DESIGN (COMMUNICATION)

This articulation agreement serves to determine that students transferring from Lane Community College with an Associates of Applied Science in Graphic Design with a G.P.A. of 3.0 or higher and having successfully completed a portfolio will have completed the requirements to transfer into the third year of the Bachelor of Design (Communication) at Otago Polytechnic. This agreement establishes the coursework required at Lane Community College, and the coursework remained to be completed at Otago Polytechnic School of Design. It intends to create curricular alignment that supports students by creating an opportunity to earn the Bachelor of Design (Communication) in three years.

Terms of agreement:

Students must be advised by Lane Community College Academic Advisors to ensure they're taking the correct coursework in a timely manner to transfer to Otago Polytechnic School of Design for their third year to complete their Bachelor of Design (Communication).

Students must keep a minimum cumulative G.P.A. of 3.0 upon graduation, and submit a professional portfolio with their application to Otago Polytechnic for the Bachelor of Design (Communication) 3rd year program.

This agreement will only indemnify coursework for students transferring to Otago Polytechnic School of Design to pursue a Bachelor of Design (Communication) in three years. Students transferring to other degree than Bachelor of Design (Communication) will be subject to evaluation of coursework independent from this agreement.

Students must follow the deadlines for application and admission to Otago Polytechnic, as part of the ongoing academic advising at Lane Community College.

Academic Advisors at Lane Community College will be in an ongoing communication with Otago Polytechnic School of Design Advising team, to create a seamless transition for Lane Community College students to Otago Polytechnic.

Otago Polytechnic is a signatory to, and complies with the New Zealand Ministry of Education's Code of Practice for the Pastoral Care of International Students.

At Lane Community College, this agreement will be administered by Dean of Student Engagement and Vice President of Academic & Student Affairs

Term, Variation and Termination

This agreement is subject to revision and modification by mutual agreement. It is generally agreed that this agreement will be reviewed on a three yearly basis. It is understood that either institution may terminate the agreement at any time, although it is assumed that such

action would only be taken after mutual consultation in order to avoid any possible inconvenience to the other institution. Each party will ensure that adequate arrangements are made to complete all commitments before the Articulation Agreement is terminated.

Proper Law

If there is any dispute regarding the terms of this Agreement, the terms will be construed according to the Laws of the country in which the student is attached for the articulation period i.e., the host institution, unless otherwise agreed in writing by the parties.

This agreement shall become effective on the day when the principals of both institutions affix their signatures to this agreement.


