Financial Aid Eligible Programs

To qualify for financial aid, a student must be enrolled or accepted for enrollment in an eligible degree or certificate program. Not all programs offered at Lane are eligible for financial aid funding.

Eligible Programs

- Associate of Arts: Oregon Transfer
- Associate of Science: Oregon Transfer
- Associate of Science
- Associate of General Studies
- Direct Transfer programs (*at least a two year program accepted for full credit toward a Bachelor's degree*)
- Most Associate of Applied Science programs (*see ineligible programs for exceptions*)
- Most Two-Year Certificate programs (*see ineligible programs for exceptions*)
- Most One-Year Certificate programs (*see ineligible programs for exceptions*)

Ineligible Programs

- AAS: Physical Therapist Assistant (*expected to be an eligible program in Fall 2009*)
- AAS: Electrician Apprenticeship Technologies (*currently under review*)
- One-Year Cert: Retail Management
- One-Year Cert: Electrician Apprenticeship Technologies
- Two-Year Cert: Electrician Apprenticeship Technologies
- Any non-credit/Continuing Education program (*e.g. Massage Therapy*)
- All degree or certificate programs not offered by Lane (*e.g. Speech-Language Pathology Assistant.*)
- All Career Pathways Certificate of Completion programs
- All Less than One-Year Certificate programs
- Suggested Courses of Study
- Prerequisites for a graduate program (*i.e., master's, doctoral, or other advanced degree*)

Important Information to Know When Choosing a Program

1. Students enrolled in an ineligible program cannot receive federal or state financial aid (including loans). These students may qualify for Private Alternative Educational loans.
2. Students who have not been accepted into their program (Nursing, Dental Hygiene, etc.) have limited or no financial aid eligibility. Because of this, we suggest these students pursue the Associate of General Studies, Associate of Arts: Oregon Transfer or the Associate of Science while completing their prerequisites. The prerequisites often fulfill the program requirements for one of these financial aid eligible degree programs.
3. The coursework needed to complete a Career Pathways certificate is the same coursework required to earn the corresponding Associate of Applied Science degree. If it is the student's intent to complete the Associate degree, then they are considered to be enrolled in an eligible program. Their program with the College should be listed as the appropriate AAS program
4. The One-Year Cert: Occupational Skills program is currently under review with the Department of Education and may be deemed to be ineligible. It is currently an eligible program.
