Technology Workshop Descriptions

Camtasia - Screen Recording and Presentation Presenter - Karin O'Rourke #1, #22

Camtasia Studio lets you easily create compelling training and presentations for Web and CD-ROM delivery, and you can do it without ever leaving your office. It is the only product versatile enough to record live PowerPoint presentations, personalized technical training sessions, and rich software demonstrations.

Easy Web Site for Instructors Presenter - Joe Escobar #2, #29 Presenter - M. Keene-Wilson #9

This hands-on session will show you how to use a course website builder that over 200 Lane instructors have started using over the last two years. If you can surf the web, click a mouse, copy and paste, and have your syllabus, handouts, or other materials in electronic form (Microsoft Word, PDF, etc.), but still do not have your own web site at LCC, this session is for you.

ArtStor Presenter - Meredith Keene-Wilson #3/#7, #23/#28

ArtStor is rich digital library of art images and descriptive information, as well as the software tools to enable active use of the collections. Content includes images from the fields of art, architecture and archeology. Learn how ARTstor's software tools support a wide range of pedagogical and research uses. Runs two consecutive workshop sessions.

Introduction to Moodle Presenter - Joe Escobar #4, #19

Last March, 2006, Lane chose opensource Moodle (over commercial products WebCT and Blackboard) as its Learning Management System (LMS). Whether you teach traditional, hybrid, or fully-online courses, here's a chance to try out a very flexible and friendly online course space. Moodle offers numerous options for setting up a class, including discussions, transferring files, announcements, grading, posting syllabi and assignments online, creating links to other web sites, and even setting up web pages and wikis! This hands-on workshop will introduce participants to the Moodle software system (<http://moodle.lanecce.edu>).

Testing with Moodle Presenter - Daniel Carrere #5, #24

Moodle can be a valuable testing tool to make tests available online, providing a means of evaluation for a variety of class types (traditional inclass, online, and hybrid models). Moodle is also able to import a variety of question formats that you may already have without retyping them. In this segment, we will introduce testing utilizing multiple choice, true / false, and essay question types. For advanced Moodle users.

Using Smart Classrooms Presenter - Michael Levick and Len Heflin #6, #25

Learn how to access, operate, adjust, troubleshoot, and secure Smart Classroom AV equipment. See how to use smart classrooms for various types of instructional media and materials.

Moodle Advanced Presenter - Joe Escobar #8, #26

Current Moodle users are encouraged to attend this advanced session, where we will work with the Moodle gradebook and activities other than the common Forums, Assignments, and Quizzes that most instructors already use. The presenter will also share helpful tips and other Moodle "secrets" which can increase your efficiency and take less time, rather than more of your time. You will also be encouraged to share your successes and learning experiences with attendees.

***This session may encourage the creation of a Moodle sharing and support group that will meet frequently online and once-a-month, face-to-face for brown bag lunches.

Quizdom - Clickers for the Classroom Presenter - Daniel Carrere #10, #20

Classrooms both present and future have the capability of registering student responses in real time and displaying them for discussion. In this segment, we will look at a tool that you can use to gauge opinion and survey questions to class participants. LCC currently owns two complete classroom survey systems from Quizdom which instructors can use.

Editing Video Clips for Effective Classroom Use with iMovie Presenter - Will Sarvis #11, #21

Learn how to edit video for effective classroom use. Only want a selected short film derived from a long one? iMovie easily allows precise selection of clips, re-ordering clip chronology, fading scenes in and out (just as in professional documentaries) adding your own audio voice-over, adding written captions, and other features.

iStream Presenter - Tamara Pinkas #12, #27

iStream is a powerful web-based resource and professional development tool that you can have at your fingertips. It is a portal-based, multimedia resource that brings the best of the League for Innovation's Conferences, publications, services, partnerships, and networking to everyone at Lane. The information housed on iStream may be of value to all Lane staff. This workshop will give a brief overview of the site and then walk attendees through setting up their own free account. As a board member League institution, Lane receives iStream at no cost. 30 minute session.

How to Reserve Rooms on LCC Campuses Using the Event Scheduler Presenter - Michael Levick #13, #16

Get a login to Lane Events and learn how to submit room reservations for meetings and special activities (not regular class meetings). Practice creating, submitting, revising, and repeating reservations.

Hybrid Courses at Lane Presenters - Faculty Webmasters #14, #17

Online and hybrid courses are possible solutions to Lane's educational challenges, but only if course design, development, implementation and evaluation, are carried out systematically with attention to pedagogy, learning, reuse and scale. There is no single tool, nor one-size-fits-all approach to online and hybrid course development and implementation; however, there is a need to create an environment to support and encourage faculty and students who want to participate in online and hybrid teaching and learning. Come learn what Lane is doing to support faculty in this area.

The State of the Mac for Faculty and Staff Computing Presenter - Dale Duvall #15, #18
