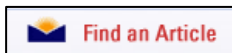


Today we'll practice using Library databases. You can find them by starting at the Library website: <http://lanecc.edu/library/>



Then, click on "Find an Article" from the list on the left.

We're going to find one magazine article and one newspaper article using two different databases, *SIRS Knowledge Source* and *Opposing Viewpoints*.

**First Database:** *SIRS Knowledge Source*

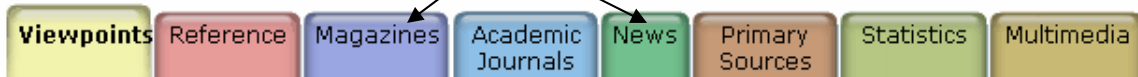
