

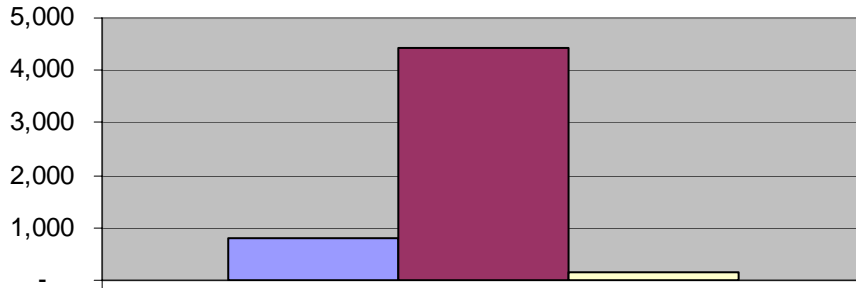
LCC Secondhand Smoke Survey Results

Total Respondents: 5,219

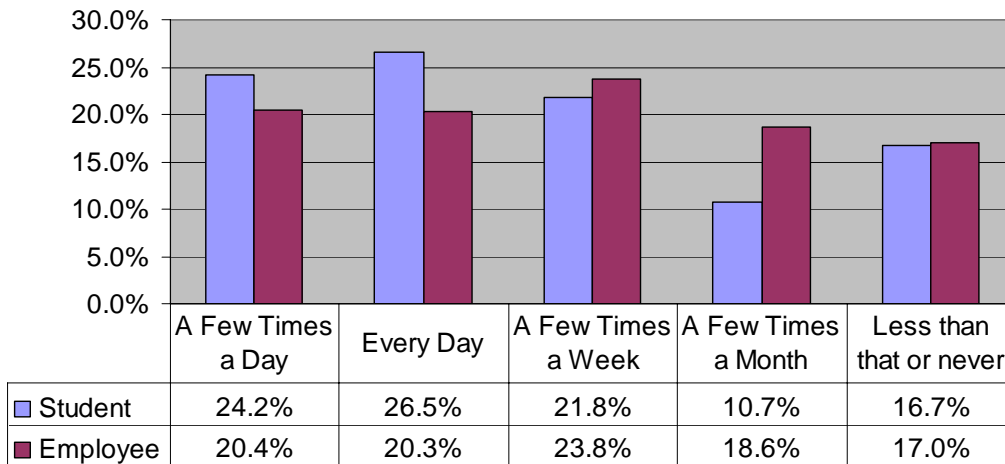

Question 1. Please identify which population you primarily fall under.

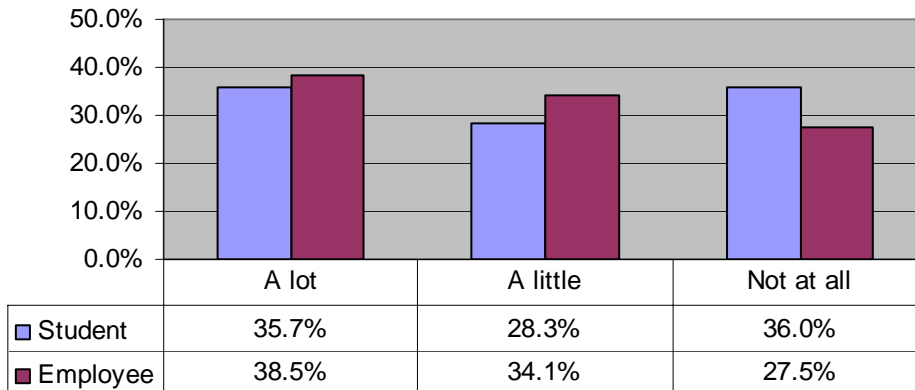

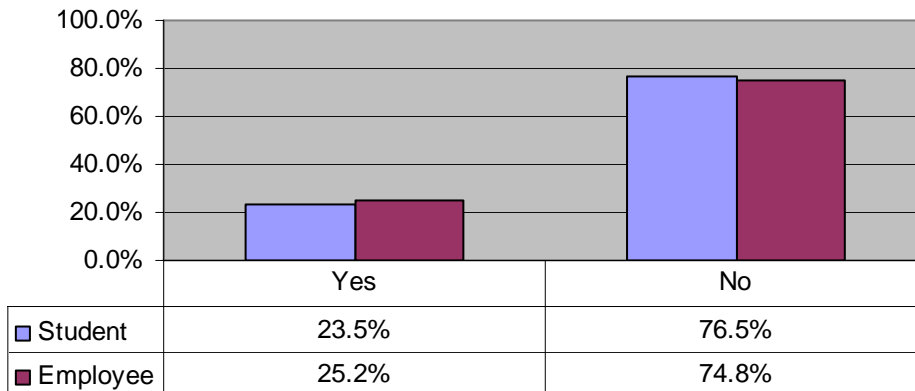

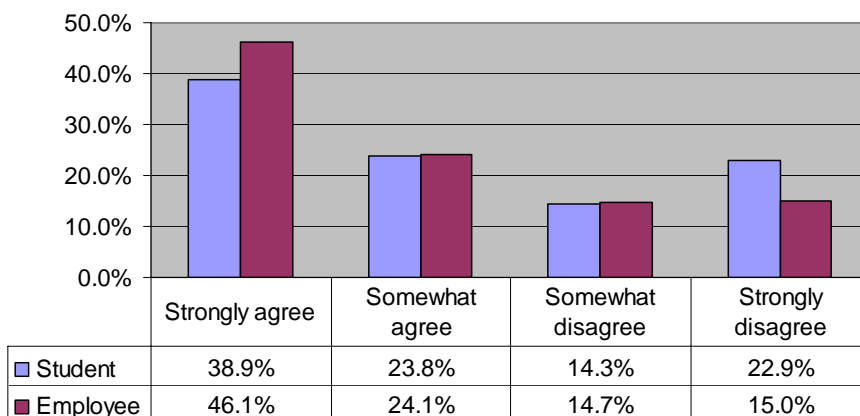
Question 3. Would you say secondhand smoke on campus typically bothers you a lot, a little, or not at all?



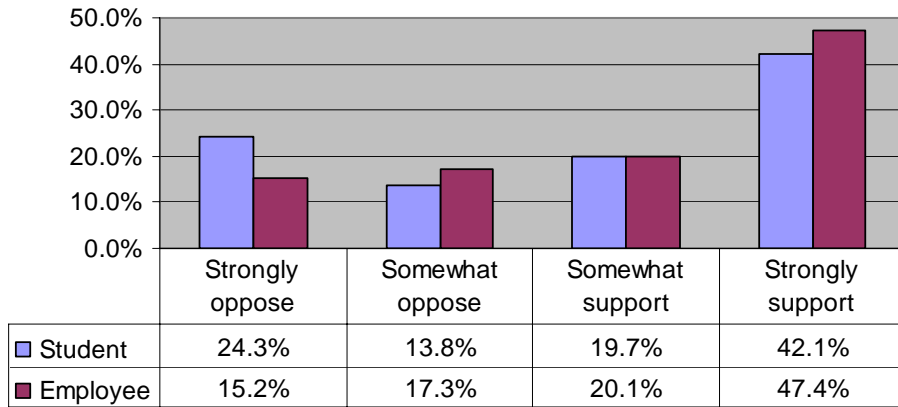
Question 4. Have you experienced any immediate health effects from second-hand smoke on campus, such as coughing, wheezing, or allergic reactions?



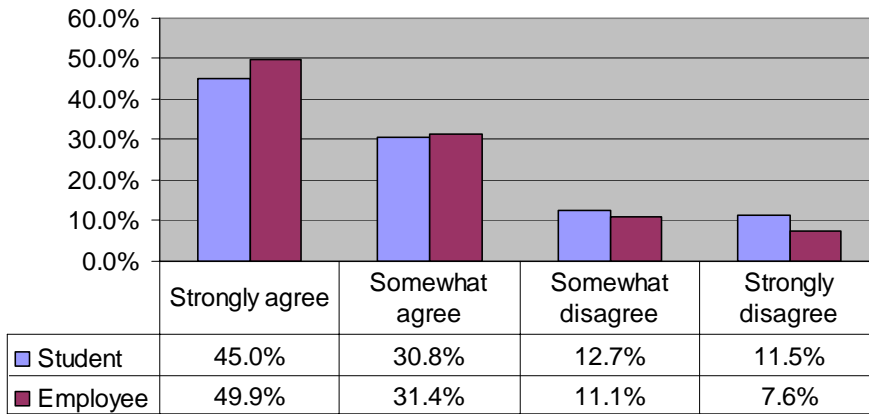

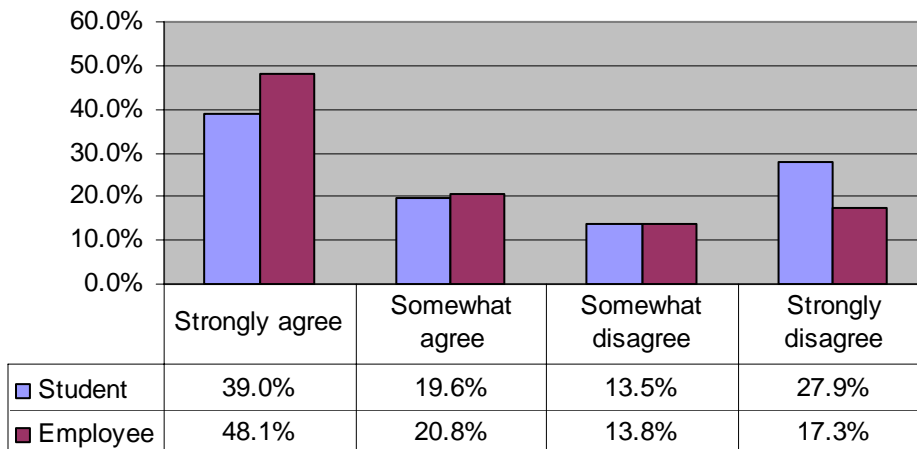
Question 6. Would you support or oppose LCC becoming tobacco-free if quit smoking services are provided?



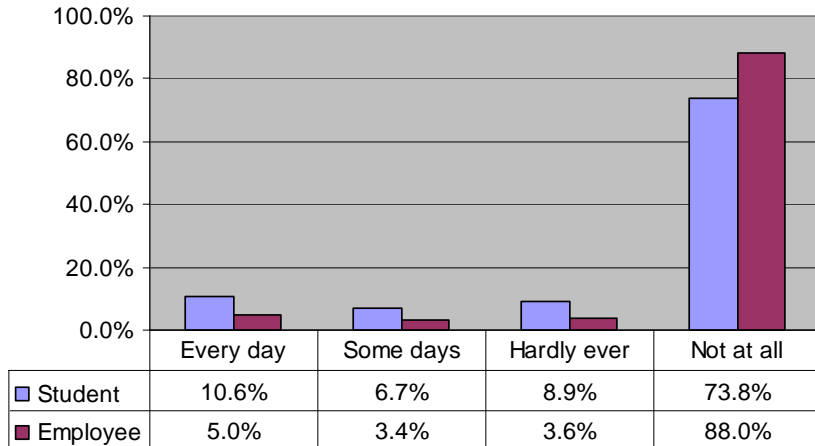
Question 7. Do you agree or disagree with the following statement: Daily exposure to even small amounts of second-hand smoke is a serious health risk.



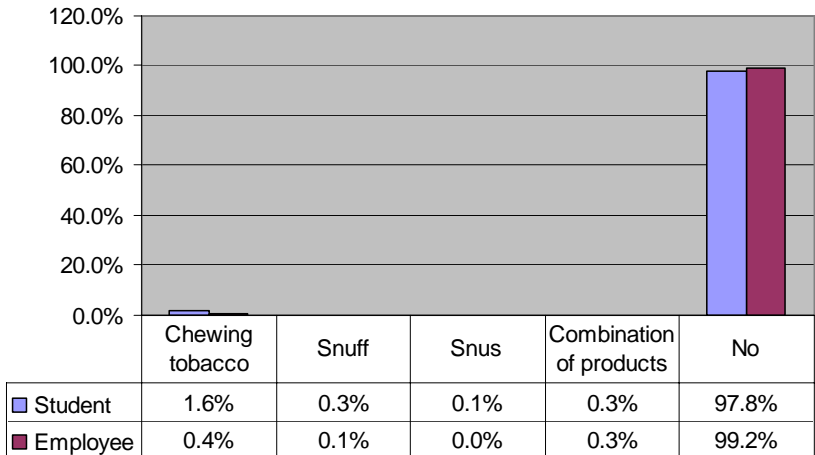
Question 8. Do you agree or disagree with the following statement: Other things being equal, I would choose a "smoke-free" college over a college that allows smoking on campus.



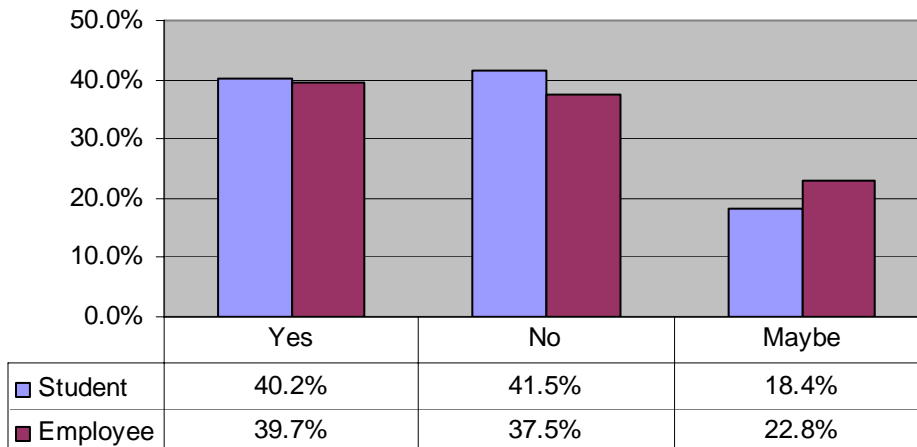
Question 9. Do you now smoke cigarettes every day, some days, hardly ever or not at all?
