WHY SCHOLARSHIPS

- FREE Money to help pay for your education
- Reduce your loans or graduate debt free
- \$6,500 loan paid back over 10 yrs at \$67 per month at 6.8% = \$8,000
- \$25,000 loan paid back over 10 yrs at \$288 per month at 6.8% = \$35,000
- If it takes 6.5 hours to complete an application and you receive a \$6,500 scholarship---You earned \$1,000 per hour

 - Transcripts
 - Applications
 - Essays and essay drafts
 - Letters of recommendation
 - Research results
 - Tracking chart

STRATEGIES FOR DEVELOPING YOUR STORY

- Journaling
- Create personal inventory
- Talking it out with others



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- It usually doesn't come out the first time---you need time and distance
- Your Story will develop as you write and rewrite

PERSONAL INVENTORY

- How do you spend your time
- What are your interests, strengths, values, goals, etc
- Volunteer service
- Community and school activities
- Leadership, honors & awards
- Family activities and contributions
- Employment history
- Life experiences-challenges-accomplishments



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WHAT COLLEGE WILL YOU BE ATTENDING NEXT YEAR?

- LCC? Oregon State University? University of Oregon? Bushnell University? Portland Community College? University of Montana? Humboldt State?
- Contact that college/university and review their list of scholarships and criteria
- Start with the college's website and or contact their financial aid office
- NOTE any admission and scholarship application deadlines! Often you must apply EARLY to the university in order to be considered for scholarships

The Ford Family Foundation

- Four Scholarships Categories
 - Ford Scholars, Ford Transfer, Ford Opportunity, and Ford Sons and Daughters
 - Available for Undocumented students
 - Awards anywhere between 25 to 100 of each category
 - ■90% of unmet need up to \$40,000 per year
 - Deadline March 1st, 5 pm PST

Essay Writing Tips

- Essays/personal statements are the most important part of your scholarship application, take time preparing them
- Read each essay question 2 or 3 times before you begin writing
- Answer all parts of the question, there are usually two or more parts
- Make introduction inviting and personal and your ending strong; use imagery
- Write from your heart; show the unique you
- Put a positive light on negative circumstances-show what you learned, how you are different today, etc

Essay Writing Tips CON'T

- Back up your education and career goals with concrete plans
- If you can, draw a connecting thread through your essays
- The reader should know who you are and what you want and feel confident that you are going to do whatever it takes to achieve your goal
- Write a rough draft, rewrite and have 2 people review them for content and grammar
- Rewrite, be patient, and invest in your future now instead of building student loan debt
- RELAX you got this





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- Be aware ---there are scams online
- Never pay for scholarship or financial aid advice
- Scams---hurry you to apply
- If it is too good to be true it probably is
- Never give out your bank account and card info or SSN!
