What is Title IX?

 Title IX protects people from discrimination based on sex in educational programs or activities that receive Federal financial assistance (this includes colleges and universities). Under Title IX, LCC students, staff and faculty areprotected from:

- Sexual Assault
- Stalking
- Dating/Domestic/Intimate Partner Violence
- Sexual Harassment
- Quid pro quo harassment
- Retaliation
- Hostile environment
- Gender-based discrimination

Know Your Rights

- Right to learn and work in a safe environment. LCCfollows a zero tolerance policy for all forms of sexualmisconduct and gender-based discrimination.
- Right to pursue a campus-based disciplinaryprocess (if applicable).
- Right to a prompt and fair investigation. LCC isrequired to investigate all reports of sexualmisconduct.
- Right to pursue civil and criminal options throughcivil court and law enforcement.
- Right to file a complaint without fear ofretaliation. Anyone who reports sexual misconduct is protected from retaliation under the law.
- Right to access support and health services. LCCoffers confidential counseling services and canconnect you with on- and off-campus resources tohelp you heal.

Terms to Know

- Sexual Harassment: Can include unwelcome sexual advances, requests for sexual favors, or other verbal, nonverbal or physical conduct of a sexual nature where such conduct is sufficiently severe or pervasive that it has the effect, of unreasonably interfering with an individual's work or academic performance or it has created an intimidating, hostile or offensive environment and would have such an effect on a reasonable person.
- Quid Pro Quo Harassment: Occurs when a person in a position of authority makes educational or employment benefits conditional upon an individual's willingness to engage in or tolerate unwanted sexual conduct.
- Sexual Assault: Unwanted conduct of a sexual nature that is inflicted upon a person or compelled through the use of physical force, manipulation, threat or intimidation. For a full list of definitions visit: https://www.lanecc.edu/copps/documents/sexual-respect-sexual-misconduct

Consent

The voluntary, informed, uncoerced agreement through words and actions freely given, which a reasonable person would interpret as a willingness to participate in mutually agreed-upon sexual acts.

- Consent to one act does not constitute consent toanother act.
- Consent on a prior occasion does not constituteconsent on a subsequent occasion.
- The existence of a prior or current relationship doesnot, in itself, constitute consent.
- Consent can be withdrawn or modified at any time.
- Consent is not implicit in a person's manner of dress.
- Accepting a meal, a gift, or an invitation for a datedoes not imply or constitute consent.
- Silence, passivity, or lack of resistance does notconstitute consent.

College Protective Measures

Interim actions can include but are not limited to:

- Imposing a "no contact" order on either party
- Scheduling and room changes
- Making a safety plan
- Interim suspension and separation from theinstitution or restrictions on participation in the community
